Application for Admission – Part 2

Autobiographical Statement:

This statement probably is the most important part of your application. In about five to seven computer or typewritten pages, please describe for the Admissions Committee:

- a) How you came to be interested in professional practice in psychology and how your personal and professional experiences have contributed to and shaped that interest;
- b) your current professional goals;
- c) why you are interested in attending The Professional School of Psychology, the strengths you bring to graduate study in psychology, and the areas in which you would like to extend your understanding or expertise.

It is important that your statement be a clear and articulate presentation of yourself. Give the members of the Committee an opportunity to get to know you through your statement. It usually is not helpful to the Committee for you to focus your statement on describing the professional positions you have held. (Your resume provides this information.) In particular it is helpful to the Committee to understand, through your statement, your values and concerns in working with people or organizations, how you learn from experience and from formal education, how you assess your present skills and competence in terms of professional practice, and how you think about your professional future.
